After moving to Dallas, she worked for United Press and later married Edward Wright, Jr., a widower with two small boys and two years later became Pres. of Bradfield PTA. This was her self- proclaimed claim to fame, becoming a bride, mother, and PTA president in two years. Four years later, Chris Wright was born. LaNeil was a charter member of Texas Game Fishing Club and an early member The Dallas Gun Club. She was active at Highland Park United Methodist Church serving as President of United Methodist Women. She was President of Armstrong Review Club, on the Board of Governors at the Dallas Woman's Club, President of Green Thumb Garden Club, a member of Marianne Scruggs Garden Club and the social welfare organization, Mary K. Craig Class. She was involved in politics at the local and national level and organized Texas Eagle Forum in 1976. Her smile and graceful manner belied her well informed positions and ability to debate with anyone. After the untimely death of her husband, she served as precinct chairman and president of Texas Eagle Forum for twelve years until she remarried General Berton E. Spivy, Jr. with whom she enjoyed over eight wonderful years. In life she mourned the deaths of her son Edward Wright, III and her grandson, Scott Wright, II.
